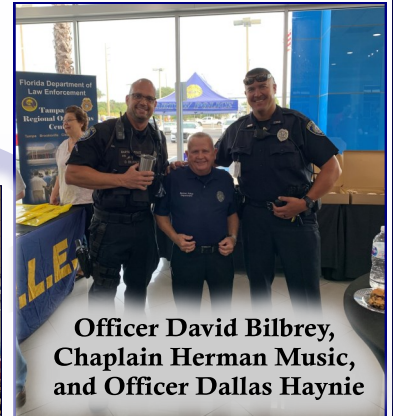

Bartow Police Department Partnership with the Bartow Chamber of Commerce

On Oct. 18th during Monday night's City Commission Meeting the Bartow Police Department introduced a new partnership with the Bartow Chamber of Commerce called Bartow Business Watch.

The partnership will be identified by the logo designed by Chamber Director Jeff Clark and is displayed in the photo. The Bartow Chamber and their members will help facilitate the Business Watch Program by sharing information and networking to offer fresh ideas and topics to include in Crime Prevention Workshops that will be offered bi-monthly.

The first Workshop, launched last week, featured a Cyber Security Presentation by Special Agent Rick Dean of the Secret Service and member of the Tampa Bay Cyber Security Task Force. The event was held at Front Page Brewing Co.

The Business Watch Program also offers Security Surveys and security camera registration. The bi-monthly workshops will include crime prevention topics relative to the business community.

The Florida Criminal Justice Executive Institute at the Florida Department of Law Enforcement announced the graduation of 14 chief executives from the Chief Executive Seminar-Class 54. The graduates, who represent criminal justice agencies from around the state, serve in leadership roles within their agencies.

The goal of the Chief Executive Seminar is to prepare Florida's criminal justice leadership for the challenging demands of the future. Class participants study trends and events that may affect criminal justice professionals and the state while developing new leadership skills to address the changes that lie ahead. This year, participants met for three weeks in Tallahassee with a focus on topics such as defining the future, organizational realities and leadership challenges.

The Florida Criminal Justice Executive Institute, established within the Florida Department of Law Enforcement and affiliated with the state university system, was established in 1990 by the Florida Legislature in recognition of the need for an innovative and multifaceted approach to the education and training of criminal justice professionals.

Bartow Police Capt. Diaz addressed the students with some words of advice before the ceremony, and Capt. Michelle Smith was also in attendance.

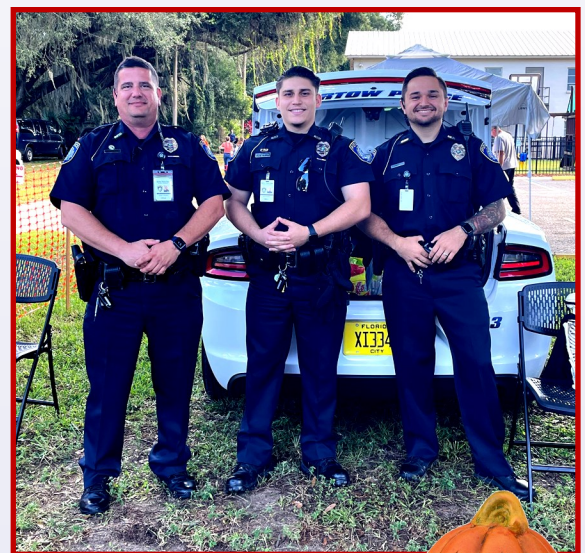


Trunk or Treat

Bartow Police Department's CST Section participated in Main Street Baptist Church "Trunk or Treat" Halloween event.

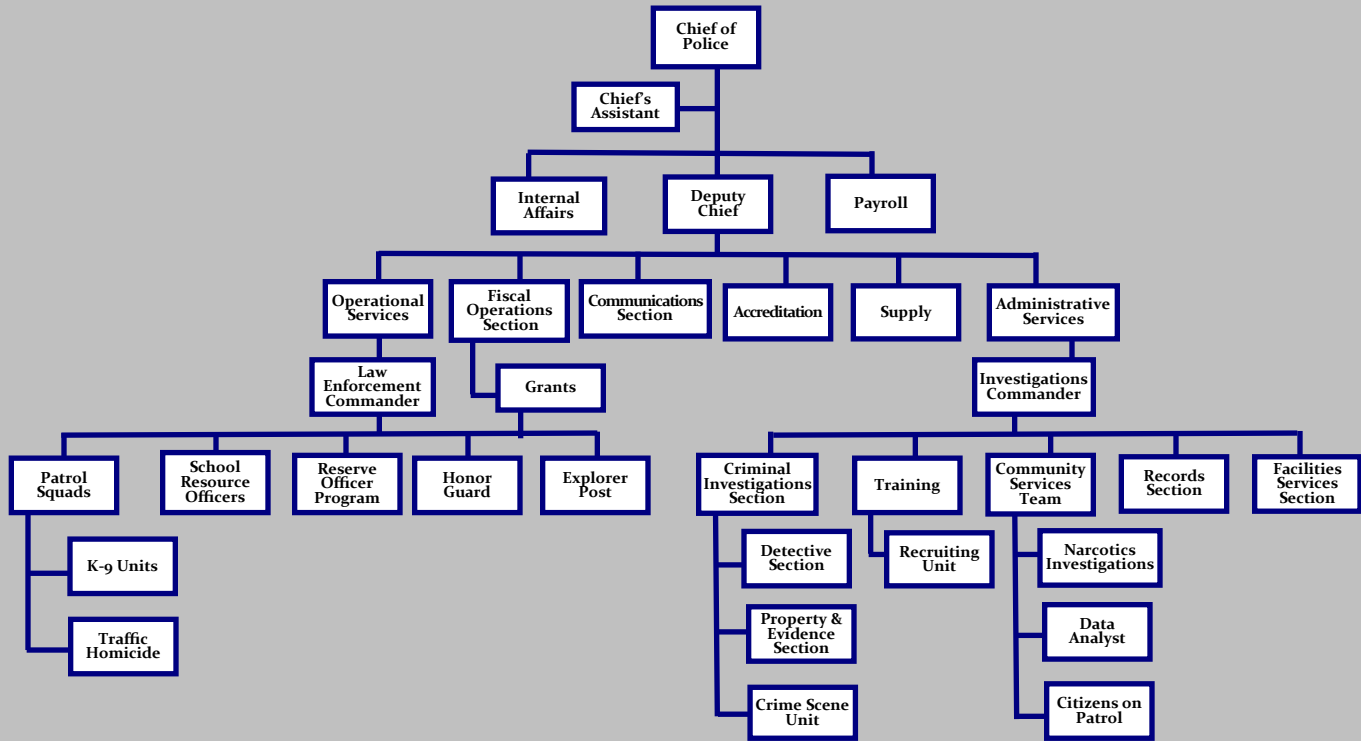

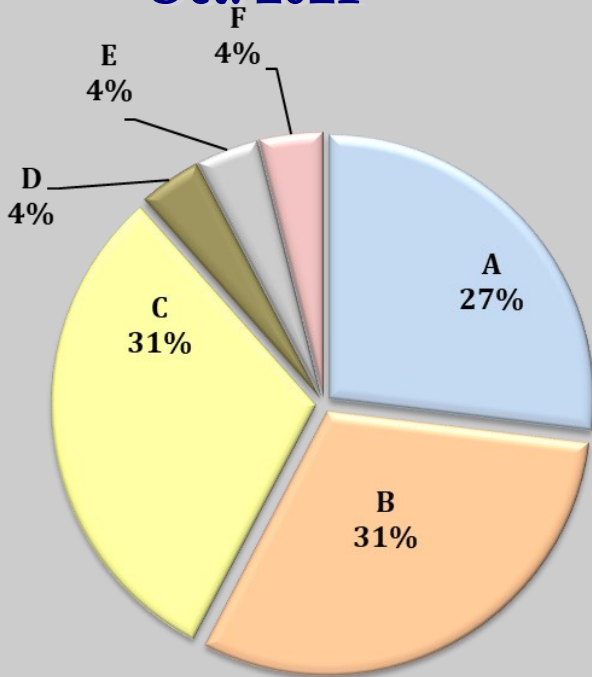
